#### **From The President**

#### **Ford Archives**

As the year closes the issue of the Australian Ford Archives has arisen again. An article in *Drive* by Joshua Dowling speculates that Ford Australia is perhaps agitating to have permission to ship the archives back to Detroit or they will be left to rot in the basement of the Broadmeadows office building. See the article <u>Fight for Ford Australia historical archives goes international - Drive</u>

It is uncertain who prompted the story that includes quotes from Ford America. The quotes do not give an indication that it is Ford pushing the idea to have the Australian Ford material shipped to Ford's central archive.

What the story has done is restart a push to have Ford Australia decide on the fate of the documents. The AHA is among a group who are pushing to have the matter settled. Led by Peter Fry, an ex-Ford Australia engineer who has followed the archive story closely, the group is preparing a submission with options.

Peter has been in touch with the relevant Ford America personnel and found they are receptive to suitable ideas for the archive's preservation.

Their Heritage Manager, Ted Ryan, told *Drive*, "*If somebody ever approached us about being creative, we can be creative, and we can figure out a way to preserve the materials (from Australia) because right now it's split between three different (areas) and I don't think anybody's winning.*"

Peter expects to have a draft submission completed by Christmas for comment. We will keep you informed.

#### Holden Heritage Event

On Sunday 4 December I was invited to participate in the Holden Heritage Day at Fishermans Bend. Initially organised by two Holden retirees, the event was handed over to the Melbourne City Council who generously took on the project at their Gateway site, located under the Bolte bridge in Lorimer street.




## **Rob Roy Hillclimb History**

The Rob Roy Hillclimb is Australia's oldest purpose-built hillclimb and opened in 1937. It closed following bushfires in the early 1960s and since reopening in 1992 the MG Car Club Victoria (of which I am currently the secretary) has operated the hillclimb under lease from the state government.

Leon Sims is a long-time member of the MG Car Club and historian of the Rob Roy Hillclimb. He wrote *A History of Rob Roy Hillclimb 1937-1961* and, with support from Penrite Oil's Dymond family, produced the History of Rob Roy DVD.


for making it available. The program includes more Rob Roy history written back then by Leon along with driver biographies and details of competing vehicles.

### **Rob Roy Revival**

On 18 and 19 March 2023, another first will occur with the inaugural Rob Roy Revival, a two day motorsport and community festival involving 75 invited

historic cars competing alongside the festival with live music, fashion shows, gourmet food, local wines and craft beers and other Yarra Valley produce.

This type of event has been made possible by a Victorian Government Community Motorsport Infrastructure grant which, along with additional funds contributed by the MG Car Club Victoria, has been used for major redevelopment works and improved spectator facilities at the track.

Spectators are encouraged to wear period dress, which will be required to enter the Paddock area.

Spectator entry to this event is by pre-purchased tickets only.

### **Tribute to Reg Hunt**



Reg Hunt – A Tribute Veteran Rolls-Royce and Grand Prix Maserati

Reg Hunt passed away on 22 August 2022 aged 99. His name will be familiar to those interested in Australian motor racing in the 1950s. He is pictured above at the wheel of his Maserati A6GCM during the Albert Park meeting in late March 1955.

Those from Melbourne may recognise his name as a very successful retailer of Holdens and other makes. He built the largest Holden distributorship in Australia and also ran a vast used car operation including 2,000 cars on a 12 acre site in Elsternwick. He sold out of the car business in 1998.

This tribute to Reg Hunt looks back to the 1950s. His connection with the Rolls-Royce Owners' Club of Australia takes us to the Victoria Branch and a veteran Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost, which is interesting but not unusual. However, how many Rolls-Royce Owners' Club members competed against motor racing royalty, literally in the case of Prince Bira of Siam, and figuratively in the case of Jack Brabham and Stirling Moss? Reg Hunt did and this takes us to his Maserati open-wheel racing cars.

### Third Pan-European Automotive Historians Conference

AHA committee member and President of the Fiat Car Club of Victoria, Roger Beattie, attended the conference in Turin. Here's his report.

It was my great pleasure to be back in my beloved Turin for the 3rd PEAHC last month. Even the accommodation had historic links for me as we were housed in the old FIAT Lingotto factory which was built from 1916-21 and includes the famous rooftop test track. Production there ended in 1982 but the building has been converted into a number of commercial spaces, including 2 hotels and a shopping centre, a performing arts complex and multiple offices, storages and public spaces. The most recent addition is the rooftop Pista 500 roof garden and the Casa 500 museum and cafe which Stellantis (current FIAT corporate incarnation) has installed for the enjoyment of the people of Turin.




Many were concerned that the loss of the track integrity on the roof was a retrograde step but seeing the crowds of families coming to learn about the automotive heritage of the city amid 40,000 plants compared to the few lonely car nuts who traversed the broken bitumen as it was I would have to say it is an enormous success. Cars can still circulate the track and a number did so celebrating the centenary of the Lancia Lambda a couple of weeks prior to my visit.

### MG Wins a Formula 1 Race

First, a correction from the previous newsletter. Johore, location of the 1949 Grand Prix written about by Eli Solomon in this story, is in Malaysia, not in Singapore.

The Johore public road circuit was a short distance from the causeway linking Peninsula Malaysia with the island of Singapore, and although not run in Singapore the race meeting was organised by the Singapore Motor Club.

Here's Eli's story again. His research into early post-war Grand Prix races led to this interesting hypothesis. If a race was run to FIA Formula 1 regulations, was it a Formula 1 race? If so, an MG TC Special called "Black Draught" driven by Mick Jennings in the 1949 Johore Grand Prix is a Formula 1 winner.


